

## **Frank Porporino**

Dr Frank Porporino holds a PhD in Clinical Psychology and has sustained a distinguished career in corrections spanning nearly 50 years as a practitioner, senior manager, researcher, educator, trainer, and consultant. Widely recognized for advancing evidence-informed practice, his contributions have earned awards from leading associations including the ACA, ICCA, Volunteers of America, and the International Corrections and Prisons Association (ICPA).

Dr Porporino began his public sector career in 1974 as a psychologist at Kingston Penitentiary, Canada's oldest maximum-security prison, and went on to serve in senior roles, culminating as the founding Director General of the Research & Statistics Branch for Corrections Canada—an internationally respected leader in applied correctional research. He was instrumental in shaping Canada's correctional programming strategy, which has since influenced systems worldwide. In 1993, he co-founded T3 Associates Consulting Inc., providing research-based training and technical assistance to correctional and social service agencies across more than 25 countries. Dr Porporino has held leadership roles in numerous professional bodies, including the American Correctional Association, the International Corrections and Prisons Association, and the International Association for Correctional and Forensic Psychology. Since 2015, he has served as founding Editor of *Advancing Corrections*, a practitioner-oriented scholarly journal launched by ICPA.

Throughout his career, he has authored numerous monographs, book chapters, and journal articles, and developed over a dozen respected cognitive-behavioural and motivational programmes for juvenile and adult offenders. His enduring focus has been on bridging research and practice to improve correctional outcomes worldwide.
